CHAIR'S REPORT Lawrence Johnson

The last day of April 2024 and I am just sitting down to write my final Chairperson's report to the Branch Newsletter. I have one more membership meeting to chair, the May 14, 2024 meeting. I have two more Branch Executive meetings to Chair, the May and September meetings and one more luncheon to oversee in June. Gloria and I have booked a river cruise in Europe for the fall so we will not be able to attend the membership meeting in September when elections will be conducted to elect a Branch Chairperson and a Branch 1st Vice-Chairperson. The branch executive is reaching out to all 700 plus branch members to step forward to take up the challenge to participate in guiding the affairs of this branch. If you are able, reach out to myself or any other executive member on how you can help. We are also looking for a new Treasurer as Gloria has indicated that she will resign at the end of the present fiscal year on December 31, 2024. The sooner someone indicates they are willing to become the Branch Treasurer the sooner we can help familiarize you with the duties of the position. There will also be a province wide Branch Treasure's meeting in Tsawwassen in October giving the new treasurer a chance to meet with other branch treasurers and the Provincial Treasurer to enable an improved understanding of the functions of Branch Treasurers and financial policy.

Again, contact any branch executive member or even better talk to Gloria Johnson on the job requirements of the Branch Treasurers position.

The Branch has it's regular monthly meetings on the second Tuesday of each month at the Unitarian Hall at 595 Townsite Road here in Central Nanaimo. Our program director Lea Campbell has lined up some interesting speakers for the remainder of 2024. We even have organizations approaching us, in one incident an organization came to us and asked to speak at one our meetings. To me this means that we are becoming known within our community and gives you a chance to become an active participant in both your branch and your community. The guest speaker for our May 14, 2024 meeting is from "Nanaimo Family Life" come to the meeting and find out how they provide service and interact with our community. Tickets for our June 11, 2024 Spring Luncheon will be available at our May 14, 2024 membership meeting at a cost of \$15.00 each for members and \$21.00 each for non members. The B.C.G.R.E.A. Directors Meeting was held via Zoom on Tuesday April 23, 2024 with the Table Officers gathered in Abbotsford. I must say that I find these Zoom meetings frustrating. I feel this format hampers full discussion and debate on issues being discussed. However that is just my personal opinion and not necessarily the opinion of others. We discussed and passed by motion a change to the Delegate Formula attending Annual General Meetings. All Branches will now send one delegate only to the Annual General Meeting plus the Chairperson of the Branch. In other words each branch will be sending two members to the Annual General Meeting regardless of the amount of members belonging to each branch. In other words the branch with the largest number of members will be entitled to the same number of delegates as the branch with the smallest number of members in the branch. I voted against this motion as did some other branches but a majority of the Directors and Table Officers voted in favour thus all branches will be sending their Branch Chair plus one more member elected as a delegate to the Annual General Meeting in October. The 1st Vice President informed the directors that our Association's Constitution and Bylaws have been updated and deposited with the authority responsible under the "Societies Act".

We also adopted a written procedure on the formation of a new branch which was researched and put forward by the "Recruitment and Retention Committee. The "Communications Committee" introduced an updated Introductory Brochure. You can view the brochure if you wish at our May meeting. If you have any ideas where we can leave some of these brochures to encourage eligible retirees or soon to be retired employees to join our association let myself or any other branch executive know. For a more detailed information please visit our website where a recording of this meeting will be posted along with a copy of the meeting minutes.

AND FINALLY I must say the past two decades have been both a challenge and a pleasure. When I retired in 2001 and moved to Nanaimo from Prince George we knew a very small number of people. However after attending my first meeting and let it be known that I was willing to help I knew that I had found a group of people who where both welcoming and helpful. Some of us have become life long friends. I thank each and everyone of you for your friendship and your support. I will continue to support this organization and branch. I hope to keep the friends that I have developed and hope to make many many more. See you at the May meeting and the June luncheon.



Kathy Torhjelm – Secretary Cranberry – Orange Scones

2 cups flour 1/3 cup white sugar 1 tbsp baking powder 1/2 tsp salt

1/2 cup unsalted butter, cold and cubed 1/2 cup cranberries 1 tbsp grated orange zest 1/2 cup table cream (maybe a little more)

1 large egg

Mix together flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Cut in butter until mealy. Add cranberries and grated zest. Mix egg and cream together. Add to dry ingredients. Add more cream if necessary to make a biscuit like dough. Knead lightly. Turn out board and cut into nine to twelve scones depending on size of cutter.

bake at 400 F for about 15 minutes.

Glaze while still warm with the following: 1 cup icing sugar, 2 or 3 tbsp orange juice, 1/2 tsp vanilla
