#### Treasurer's Report for the April 30, 2025 AGM

I am pleased to present our 2024 financial statements (pages 2-6) and the 2025 budget (page 7). Traditionally these statements compare the reporting year with the prior year. Because we changed our yearend in 2023 from June 30<sup>th</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, annual comparisons were not available and instead these statements break out 2024 spending for the provincial level (centralized spending) and the branch level (23 provincial branches). Next year the statements will again compare the current year to the prior year.

We ended 2024 with a small surplus of about \$34,000 which, along with a healthy year end balance, allows us to fund the 2025 member survey, expand our association newsletter (The PEN), absorb increasing operating costs, and continue to support member programs. There is no imminent need to raise member dues.

While our overall cash is sufficient to fund our spending plans for the coming year, it is still unevenly distributed between the various branch and provincial level bank accounts. Therefore, rather than allocate the same proportional share of member dues to every branch, we will continue to use a funding formula that ensures those branches without surplus funds will have at least \$10 per member to fund their annual operations.

At the AGM I will briefly highlight our significant expenses from last year and our budget for this year. And I will compare historical cash on hand to our annual income and expenses for the branch and provincial levels.

I would like to thank the Finance Committee (Chair: Sarf Ahmed; Members: Brian Taylor, Dan Anderson, David LaBar, George Bowden, Kathy Torhjelm, Terry Burgess) for their advice and support throughout the year and their help in preparing our 2025 budget. And a special thanks to Kathy Torhjelm who, along with her many duties as our Association Secretary, was also my second signer/approver for all provincial level expenses.

### British Columbia Government Retired Employees' Association 2024 Financial Review

<u>Purpose</u> – To provide a reasonable assurance to the membership that:

- dues and other contribution for the Province have been deposited to the Provincial bank account;
- · expenses are appropriate, properly approved and recorded; and
- Provincial bank balance reconciles to the treasurer's financial records.
- Association's financial statements correctly represent the financial position of the Provincial Level plus the 23 Branch Levels.

<u>Process</u> – The financial review will be conducted by a committee of two people that have not been involved in the financial transactions at the Provincial Level. The committee will review the records and sign off below. Not all transactions need to be reviewed. The committee can randomly select a sample of about 10% of the transactions or select one or two months to review in detail.

<b>√</b>	The committee will check for the following:
V	All Provincial Level funds are kept in an approved financial institution and there are two authorized signers on the account.
V	The January 1, 2024 Provincial Level opening balance matches the prior year's closing balance
	The December 31, 2024 Provincial bank statement reconciles to the Provincial Level records.
1	Based on the sample entries reviewed, there is supporting documentation for the Provincial Level income and expenses.
/	Based on the sample entries reviewed, Provincial Level financial records appear to be complete and up to date.
	Based on the year-end financial information provided by the Branches, the Association's total income, expenses and year end cash balance includes the income, expenses and cash balances reported by every Branch
	The Association's total balance on January 1, 2024, plus all funds received, minus all expenditures, equals the Association's total balance on December 31, 2024.

### Notes to the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024

#### Note 1 - General

The British Columbia Government Retired Employees' Association (BCGREA) is a member funded not-for-profit association registered under the *Societies Act of BC*. The primary goal of the BCGREA is to obtain benefits for its members and strive to prevent erosion of these benefits. The Association's activities are governed by its Constitution and Bylaws which are available on its website: bcgrea.ca. The Association has over 11,000 members and 24 branches - 23 physical branches located throughout British Columba and one virtual branch for members living outside of British Columbia.

#### Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

The Association uses the cash basis of accounting. It recognizes revenues when cash is received, and expenses when they are paid. Capitalization Policy: The Association capitalizes furniture and equipment that has a cost of \$2,500 or more.

#### Note 3 - Administrative Services

Members can access the services and benefits that accrue through the affiliation of companies and other associations having specific products and services designed for the benefit of retirees. The Association receives payments for the administrative costs incurred in exchange for the marketing opportunity. The following payments were received in 2024:
