BCGREA Branch 900 Meeting--March 19, 2025 Our Redeemer Lutheran Church Auditorium

The meeting was called to order by Maurice Davidson. 33 members were present.

Frances Monro introduced our speakers Jo-Ann Ruppenthal and Shelley Hall from South Okanagan Similkameen Community Policing—for part 1 of a 2-part series on frauds and scams.

Those present took in a very informative presentation on various financial scams that are currently operational nationally, as well as locally by various means. Some of the most common are:

Door to door solicitation for charities: A lanyard and name tag does not mean the solicitation is legitimate. Most charities do not have door-to-door solicitation these days. **Phone scams:** Caller ID will list a local number, but the number has been 'spoofed'. Do not answer your phone unless you know the number on the call display. Al can pick up your voice and copy it to be used in other scams. To be safest, do not personalize your answering machine message.

Social media/e-mails: Do not open any links.

E-mail scams: Previously, scam emails contained spelling and grammar mistakes. All is now being utilized to draft messages, and are written at university level English.

Facebook Marketplace: Do not e-transfer funds to hold a purchase. Deal with 'cash only'.

Grandparents' Scam: This scam has been widely operational within the Okanagan. Currently the callers are providing a courier to pick up funds that they indicate are needed to assist grandchildren who are in trouble. Remember—if you do connect with a caller that insists on secrecy and time sensitive action on your part—it's probably a scam. Check with a trusted friend/family member before doing anything.

Purchasing Gift Cards: 'Scammers' are stealing gift cards at local stores. (The cards that are in a rack—before they are loaded.) They photocopy the bar codes of other cards in their possession; then return the gift card to the merchandiser to sell. The merchandiser does not realize that the gift card has been altered and loads the card. However, instead of loading the card that you just purchased, the money has gone to the gift card that is in the scammer's possession. If purchasing gift cards, run your finders over the bar code at the back. It should be smooth—nothing raised.

CRA and Pay BC: Do not email or call asking for money or to use gift cards to pay outstanding debts.

On-Line Business Searches: There are many 'scam businesses' advertising on the web. Just because they are listed and give contact information does not mean that the business is legitimate. Before entering into a contract, or providing deposits for work, do your homework and determine that the business is above board.

Remember: It's not "If" you should get scammed nowadays, it's "When". Do not be embarrassed to talk to a trusted friend/family member, or reach out to the RCMP if you think you are a victim of a scam.

Attachment: Reporting a Scam

The Penticton RCMP Detachment utilizes a non-emergency call on-line platform. Types of calls to report via this method: http://report.rcmp.ca

A crime with no suspect; a non-emergency crime, where the suspect is not on the scene; reporting a serious crime after a lengthy delay; non-emergency incidents in progress; on-going crime, not in-progress; suspicious circumstances that may indicate an on-going criminal activity. This platform captures events happening the community and is utilized for staffing, etc. No crime is too small to report by this method.
